MEMORIALIZED by Ben Rominske, minister

I grew up in the wake of 9/11 and with that I saw my fair share of people enlist. Reasons vary from one person to the next for serving. This coming Monday is a time for us to remember and pay our respects to those who lost their lives in standing for our great many liberties. Such a sacrifice deserves more than just a great amount of respect yet with such a holiday I cannot help but think of some biblical parallels.

Memorials, signs, and times of remembrance were quite common from Noah onward. One memorial I remember well is in Joshua 4:20-22 which says, “And those twelve stones, which they took out of the Jordan, Joshua set up at Gilgal. And he said to the people of Israel, “When your children ask their fathers in times to come, ‘What do these stones mean?’ then you shall let your children know, ‘Israel passed over this Jordan on dry ground.’” Joshua understood just how needed this was for the people. Those memorial stones would serve as a continual reminder of what the Lord God had done for them.

There are many other examples we could look at but none is greater than what Christ himself instituted. Luke 22:18-20 says “For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.” And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.” The emblems we partake of every first day of the week are a memorial to the sacrifice that was made on our behalf just as the stone that was rolled away reminds us of his resurrection.

So as we near such a holiday please do not forget to give our fallen troops your thoughts and prayers. All the while, let us take note of how important memorials have been for the Lord’s people and continue to be with Christ’s perfect covenant. After all, each human is a portion of reflection upon God and each Christian not only bears the name of our Savior but lives as a continual remembrance of Him.

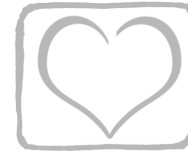
